



### **Brunel Mile:**

Conceived as a millennium project, the Brunel Mile links Bristol Temple Meads station with Canon's Marsh via the Port wall and Harbourside. Designed as an environmental route for walkers and cyclists, it celebrates the engineering achievements of Isambard Kingdom Brunel, who built the Great Western Railway from London Paddington to Bristol. His vision was to devise an integrated transport link from London to New York, whereby rail passengers would alight at Temple Meads, stay overnight at the Brunel Hotel and then embark on the Steam Ship Great Britain – now restored and berthed in the dry dock at the end of the Brunel Mile.
