



Jody Rosenblatt Naderi

Professor Jody Rosenblatt Naderi is the Chair of the Landscape Architecture Department, at Ball State University, Indiana in the USA. The interview begins with Jody talking about her research into street trees and their effect on driver and pedestrian behaviour. We discuss how cities can be judged on how civilise they are by the quality of the walking environment they offer and ends with a discussion of Jody's research into the Philosopher's walk.
