The Automobile Association's "Fuel for Thought" campaign published research on fuel consumption and the effect of 20 mph area-wide speed limits: http://www.theaa.com/public_affairs/news/20mph-roads-emissions.html

It measured the fuel consumption of a car travelling at a steady speed of 20mph and 30mph and found that the car used 10 percent more fuel at 20mph. However Robert stresses that the fuel consumption of a car travelling at a steady speed has no relevance at all to urban driving conditions where there are constant cycles of acceleration and braking. He estimates using the model for the EU urban test cycle that keeping a car to a maximum speed of 20 mph as opposed to 30mph actually reduced fuel consumption by just over 10 percent. Using his own measurements he has found that careful driving at 20mph can reduce fuel consumption by more than 20 percent. The slower speed allows drivers to anticipate hazards and obstacles and coast past them, whereas at 30mph drivers have to use their brakes to bring the speed down to a safe speed, but in doing so waste energy in the process.
