

Graham Stevens:

Graham Stevens is an environmental scientist, avant garde artist and inventor who has created a number of pneumatic inflatable structures, that have helped us to explore solutions to global warming, bounce about at parties, and walk on water.

In this interview, recorded on the tops of the downs in the west of the Isle of Wight, walking along a route dedicated to 17th century scientist, Robert Hooke, whose birthplace was at nearby Freshwater, Graham explains how walking has been fundamental to his own creativity.
