

Stefan van der Spek

Stefan van der Spek is Associate Professor of Urban Design and Director of the Geomatics Educational Programme at Delft University of Technology, in their Faculty of Architecture & the Built Environment. His research includes tracking people on foot using GPS receivers, following them through shopping and town centres, to visualise how they use the built environment. His research is already revealing trends in increased walking to and from car parking and by workers in their lunch breaks, however, he is not entirely optimistic in his forecast.
