Nick's recommendation for a walk is:

- 1. Catbells, Lake District take the Keswick launch to Hawes End across Derwent Water, walk over Catbells to the Barandlehome jetty to return by launch to Keswick.
- 2. Paglesham in Essex, at the confluence of the Roach and Crouch rivers
- 3. Bretton Clough, a hidden valley in the Peak District with The Barrel Inn at the top http://www.thebarrelinn.co.uk/
