

Grace Adam

On an icy December day, walking with a friend in Queen's Wood in north London, Andrew Stuck came across an intriguing set of pedestrian signs on which were written lines of poetry, lyrics, and instructions. His curiosity got the better of him, and when he got home, he tracked down who had been responsible. Returning to the wood in January, when the muddy ground was as slippery underfoot, he interviewed **Grace Adam** to find out what had been her motivation, in creating the installation called "**Out of the Woods...Words to navigate by**". 20'05" 9.5MB
