Andrew Stuck and **Sinwah Lai** have been in Psarades in north-western Greece attending the Walking Arts Encounter where the temperature hasn't dropped much below 40°C. What it means is that Andrew interviews walking artists, either in the shade or as late into the evening as possible. Fortunately, the days are long, but the heat is exhausting.

Both Sinwah and Andrew have been feeling the heat as they set out from her guesthouse on a short walk. Sinwah has been to Psarades before and has returned because she has fond memories. Sinwah is a Chinese artist from Hong Kong, but she's travelled quite a bit including to study in Taipei in Taiwan and to Utrecht in the Netherlands. Sinwah's suggested walks

- 1. Standing in front of a bridge- write something on the palm of your hand something difficult for you as you walk across the bridge rub out the word with your other hand
- 2. Walking meditation- one step at a time one step at a piece
